




#### **MESSAGE FROM THE RABBIS:**

During the holiday season, we recite twice daily Psalm 27, in which we call out to God:

אַחַת וֹ שַּׁאַלִתִּי מֵאֵת ֹ ה' אוֹתָהּ אֲבַקֵּשׁ שִׁבְתִּי בְּבֵיִת ֹה' בֶּלֹיְמֵי חַיַּי

One thing that I ask of you God, that shall I seek: That I dwell in the House of God all the days of my life ..."

The Psalmist makes just one simple request from God - to live in God's Bayit, to reside in the sweetness of God's home. This year, we have built a Bayit that is large enough for each and every person to find their own seat in our home. We have dynamic programs, spiritually uplifting prayer services, classes for children and adults alike, and youth activities that will leave our children asking for more. And we at the Bayit ask just one small thing - that each of you seek out the class or program that speaks to you, that enters your soul and that helps you grow.

## **Construction Update**

**Driveway:** We have just completed the paving of our driveway.

**Exterior work on Main Sanctuary:** Long deferred pointing and other maintenance has been completed on the north side and is now underway on the south side.

Kitchen: Installation of our kitchen equipment has begun.

**Movable Wall for dividing Social Hall:** Is in fabrication and is scheduled for installation in mid-October.

**Lighting in Main Sanctuary:** We are working with a lighting consultant on options for enhancing the lighting for certain areas of the Main Sanctuary.

**Baby Changing Tables:** Three new baby changing tables have been installed in the main level men's bathroom, in the third floor children's bathroom and in the lower level nursing room.

**Yahrtzeit Plaques:** The ritual committee is deciding on an appropriate location and re-installation is anticipated shortly after Sukkot, if not before.

Bookcase for Siddurim for Main Sanctuary: An additional bookcase (for the mens' side of the entrance vestibule) will be installed between Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur.

**Air-Conditioning:** The new system is not yet working optimally and we are working with our design engineer, contractor and consultants to properly balance the system. We appreciate your patience and understanding in the meantime.

**Elevator:** The elevator has not worked properly since it was installed. This is a top priority of the building committee and, here again, we appreciate your patience as we work to address the situation.

**Punchlist:** We have a long list of punchlist items that our general contractor is working on.

**Pledges:** If you have not yet made a pledge to the Building Fund, please do so during this High Holiday Season as we cannot complete and pay for this Project without the support of the entire HIR Family. If you have already made a pledge, we thank you and ask that you redeem your pledge as early as possible.
