#### Sixth Grade JYEP: Mitzvah Year:

In the sixth grade, we aim to gear our students towards thinking about their Bar and Bat Mitzvahs. Our curriculum is based upon the Ziv Giraffe Curriculum which focuses on being conscious of *Tikkun Olam* – "Repairing the World." We also hope that your entire family will participate in more of the programming made available by the JYEP and the larger synagogue community. Classes only meet for one hour on Sunday mornings from 10:30am-11:30am following the Big Sibling Program session from 9:30am-10:30am. Parents are encouraged to meet with the JYEP Rabbi to pick dates for the Bar/Bat Ceremony and discuss any preliminary preparations.

#### **Seventh Grade JYEP: Junior Philanthropy Project:**

Our Bar/Bat Mitzvah students will have the opportunity to be of an exciting initiative that we successfully launched in recent years. Instead of regular classes during their Seventh grade year, students will meet each Sunday morning from 10:30am-11:30am after the <a href="Big Sibling Program">Big Program</a>, and be "incorporated" as a Philanthropic Board of Directors. They will learn about the needs of their community and be asked to make serious decisions about communal responsibility. The JYEP Rabbi will also guide each student and their family through the Bar/Bat Mitzvah planning process.
